Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

elcome back and bear down!
"Strive to enter through the narrow gate."—*Luke 13*. "So, strengthen your drooping hands and weak knees. Make straight the paths for your feet, that what is lame may not be disjointed but healed."—*Hebrews 12*.

Welcome back from your summer breaks and adventures! I hope these months have been a time of rest, renewal, and enrichment. And if you are new to the St. Thomas More Newman Catholic Community—a very special welcome to you! We'd love for you to join us at our *Welcome BBQ*—a perfect way to meet friends, share good food, and get connected with all that's happening here at Newman. This year is especially meaningful: we are beginning the celebration of the Newman Center's 100th anniversary, a yearlong journey from this fall through next. It is truly a once-in-a-century moment, and we are excited to celebrate with you—students, alumni, and friends alike.

Our theme for this school year is inspired from the Gospel of John (17:21): "May they be one" into "May We Be One." This call to unity reminds us that discipleship is never just an individual path, but a shared journey. Christ calls us not only to walk with Him personally, but to live, grow, and witness together in unity—so that the world may come to see Him through us. Today's readings invite us to grow into that unity through discipline. At first, discipline can feel like discomfort or even restriction. But, as Hebrews says, over time it yields "the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it." This is why your field of study is called a discipline: it stretches your mind, heart, and soul toward deeper ways of living and understanding. True discipline—rooted in discipleship—trains us to recognize what is true, beautiful, lasting, and of God. It helps us hear His voice through both noise and silence, and to discover what truly draws us closer to Christ. Without this God-shaped discipline, it's easy to be swept up in worry: Am I praying the right way? Does my professor or colleague like me? How can I gain approval? But discipline formed in discipleshipprayed, practiced, and healthy... tunes our ears to God's voice, focuses our vision, and aligns our steps so that our lives mirror His love. And when that happens—when we hear Him, see Him, and reflect Him—others are loved, healed, and transformed through Christ at work in us. And one day, when we knock at heaven's door, the Lord will not ask, "Who are you?" but will say: "Well done, good and faithful steward of my love." So once againwelcome home to your community.

May we "bear down" in the pursuit of Christ, may we truly be one, and may our lives shine so brightly with His love that the Lord Himself recognizes us at the gate.

Amen! Alleluia!


