# Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

n today's Gospel from St. John, we hear words both familiar and life-changing: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." What greater adventure could there be than this? To truly live. To rise above what weighs us down. To enter into the fullness of life that God longs to give. God did not spare even His own Son but laid down His life so that we might live. This is love at its most profound—a love that transforms us into vessels of grace, marked by hospitality, generosity, and charity.

It is always striking to look out at this community—new and returning students, faculty and staff, professionals and alumni; a tapestry of faces from first-year through graduate, from across Arizona and beyond borders of state, country, race, and perspective. As your pastor, it remains one of my greatest privileges to welcome you each year to this Mass of the Holy Spirit—this gathering of our entire community on this Sundayinviting the Spirit's empowerment to flow over, in, and through us. When I see you all, I see the Body of Christ. I see a symphony of creation—tuning itself to play the music of the St. Thomas More Catholic Newman Center for 2025–2026. And this year is exceptional. We mark our centennial—ninetynine years behind us, and this year leading into 100 years (1926–2026) of gathering here to be transformed by an encounter with the Spirit of Truth and the love of God. A century of students encountering Christ in Mass and sacraments, through retreats, Bible studies, small groups, and through service on Student Ministry, Torch Teams, and in this building itself. But now we must ask: What will our music sound like this year? Will it be sharp or flat, loud or soft, rhythmic or smooth? Will we sing solos or blend into a larger choir? Will our song be in a key others can hear, follow, and join? Leo XIII once reminded us that God has never abandoned His people, but remains with us like a gentle breeze—restoring hope and unity. "God's joy is not loud," he said, "but it truly changes history and draws us closer to one another." That is the kind of harmony we are called to play this year: not a noisy or self-centered song, but one that quietly restores, unites, and transforms. When we live this way, we step out of complacency and into the abundant flow of God's life. For Jesus assures us, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there in their midst." Look around, people of God. We are far more than two or three! Christ is here, inviting us into life, mercy, joy, adventure, and compassion as this new semester begins at the Newman Center. So let us ask for excellence—not only in our academics, but in grace, in faith, and in every encounter with one another. May we join our voices to the symphony of creation, allowing the Holy Spirit to guide the music of this year so that God's blessings will resound across campus and into the wider world.

May this excellence deepen our study, unite faith with reason, and raise our gaze beyond theories and self-made realities—towards a world fractured by war, shifting economies, climate change, polarization, and the loss of genuine human dialogue. How will we encounter one another this year? I pray it will be with the same Holy Voice that spoke to Moses at the burning bush: "Do not be afraid." Do not be afraid of deeper life. Do not be afraid of new possibilities. Do not be afraid of becoming the best version of yourself. So today, may we turn to one another with real love and presence—not with fear, ego, or doubt—and wish each other peace. For in Christ and in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God is giving us another chance to do something amazing. May the Holy Spirit surround us and bring to fruition the work of our hands. Peace be with you. Welcome to your community.

Amen! Alleluia!


