Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Our Gospel today presents a verse that is both simple and pondersome: *"The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones."*

With these words, Jesus calls us to authenticity... an integrity that shows itself not only in big decisions, but in the daily choices and encounters that shape our lives. The parable He offers is surprising:

- A steward who has been careless and dishonest suddenly faces losing his position.
- Out of fear for his future, he quickly becomes resourceful.
- Too weak to dig and too proud to beg, he devises a plan...
- Reducing debts so that others will look kindly on him when he is out of work.
- What is striking is that Jesus praises his cleverness, not his dishonesty.
- He points out how the steward knew how to act "decisively" when everything was on the line.

The challenge for us is clear:

- If someone can be so shrewd when motivated only by self-preservation, how much more intentional and creative should we be when working for God's kingdom?
- Jesus is urging us not to become complacent or lazy in our faith..... but to pour the same energy, creativity, and commitment into.... acts of love, mercy, and service.

We are called to be "crafty" in the best sense...

- Not cutting corners or manipulating, but finding new ways to bring compassion into a broken world, new ways to show mercy, new ways to build bridges of trust.
- In the small matters of kindness and in the greater matters of justice, may we be faithful, resourceful, and wholehearted disciples.

"May We Be One!
Amen! Alleluia!"

SEASON OF CREATION 2025

Monday, Sept 22

Scripture: "You give them their food in due season; when you open your hand, they are filled with good things." (Psalm 104:27-28)

Prayer: Generous God, open your hand to bless the earth with abundance, and teach us to share its gifts with all.

Tuesday, Sept 23 – St. Pius of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio)

Scripture: "The prayer of a righteous person is very powerful." (James 5:16)

Prayer: Lord, through the example of St. Pio, help us live in prayerful trust, drawing strength to care for creation and one another.

Wednesday, Sept 24

Scripture: "Let justice surge like waters, and righteousness like an unfailing stream." (Amos 5:24)

Prayer: God of justice, may your Spirit flow like a mighty river, renewing the earth and refreshing the weary.

Thursday, Sept 25

Scripture: "As a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you." (Isaiah 66:13)

Prayer: Tender God, comfort us in our fears about the future of the earth and give us courage to act with hope.

Friday, Sept 26 – Sts. Cosmas and Damian

Scripture: "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds." (Psalm 147:3)

Prayer: Divine Healer, bless those who care for the sick and wounded, and teach us to heal the wounds of creation.

Saturday, Sept 27 – St. Vincent de Paul

Scripture: "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25:40)

Prayer: Lord, through the witness of St. Vincent, may we serve Christ in the poor and in the fragile earth that sustains them.

Sunday, Sept 28 – 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Scripture: "If there is any encouragement in Christ, any solace in love, any participation in the Spirit... complete my joy by being of the same mind." (Philippians 2:1-2)

Prayer: Spirit of unity, draw us together in love, so that with one heart we may praise God and care for creation.
