Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Over the next six Sundays, the Gospels invite us to take a deeper dive into what it truly means to follow Jesus, the Christ. "May We Be One!"

In this Sunday's Gospel, we meet Lazarus, the beggar, and the Rich Man, who dressed well and dined abundantly. Lazarus longed for scraps from the Rich Man's table, yet the man never "saw" him or his hunger. Strikingly, even the dogs noticed Lazarus' sores and tried to comfort him. Discipleship requires that we *see* and respond. To follow Jesus means breaking through our fears, prejudices, and blindness—and pouring out our lives in love.

Amen! Alleluia!

Monday, Sept 29 – Feast of Sts. Michael, Gabriel & Raphael (Archangels)

Scripture: “Bless the Lord, all you angels, mighty in strength, acting at his behest.”
(Psalm 103:20)
