## Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

ovember is a month set aside for remembrance—a time when we hold close the memory of our beloved who have gone before us. As a Church, we gather throughout the world to celebrate the feasts of All Saints and All Souls, uniting our prayers with those holy women and men who, across the centuries, have lived as true "friends of God."

In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds us of the posture of a disciple. He tells us not to lead from a place of exaltation, but from humility. Titles, positions, or honors—while sometimes entrusted to us—are not ends in themselves. They are gifts from God, given so that we might serve. To be a disciple is to use whatever role we hold as a mirror of God's love, expressed in both word and deed. At the heart of our calling is the title we all share: *Christian, disciple, servant of God*. Through these names, we grow in friendship with the Lord by loving God, neighbor, and ourselves—with everything we are and everything we have. 
