Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Here at the St. Thomas More Catholic Newman Center, we are preparing to celebrate a remarkable milestone—our Centennial Anniversary, beginning in Fall 2025 and continuing through Fall 2026. We are filled with gratitude for one hundred years of faith, friendship, and formation—and we'd love for you to be part of this celebration. If the Newman Center was part of your Wildcat journey—welcome home! We invite you to reconnect through our alumni network during this centennial year so we can keep you informed about upcoming celebrations and share how Newman continues to grow and serve the University of Arizona community. This Sunday's Gospel beautifully coincides with the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica—the mother church of Rome and a powerful symbol of unity for the entire Church. Jesus' righteous anger may startle us, yet it arises from that deep, authentic place—the meeting point of truth, integrity, and divine purpose. His cleansing of the temple calls each of us to the same work: to keep our sacred spaces—both physical and spiritual—pure and open to God's transforming presence. Because home can only exist on holy ground—where authenticity flows freely, hearts are unburdened, and the light of Christ dwells and renews all things.

May we be one in the Light of Christ And may we "Bear Down" in faith and hope, allowing every encounter to transform us ever more deeply in the truth and love of God.

Amen! Alleluia!


