



Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

We are drawn into a Gospel that echoes the theme from our 2022–2023 academic year: “*For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be.*” It’s a timeless reminder that we are stewards of all that God has entrusted to us—our time, talents, relationships, and resources. As I reflect on the week past—including the joyful chaos of ComicCon—I’m reminded of a famous line from Spider-Man: “With great power comes great responsibility.” While it may sound like pop culture, its roots are deeply biblical. Jesus reminds us in this Sunday’s Gospel that our lives are not our own. We have been given much, and from us, much will be expected. If we are to let God’s light shine through us, we must pray for the strength and courage to live with integrity and purpose—especially when it’s hard. And yes... it is hard. But not impossible—with the help of Christ, and the abiding grace of the Holy Spirit. May God’s grace be the treasure that grounds us, anchors our hope, and animates our love for others.

St. Dominic, whose feast we celebrate today, offers us a beautiful image of what it means to live beneath the fountain of God’s grace. He allowed his soul to be filled to overflowing—and from that overflow, he shared the fruits of his contemplation with others. Where Dominic stood beneath the fountain and remained, St. Francis would take his bucket, pour it out in generous service, and return again for more.

Today, as we celebrate the witness of our Holy Father Dominic—gathered in prayer, study, community, and the preaching charism of the Order of Preachers—may his prayers and example lead us deeper into faith, hope, and trust in the loving providence of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
