



# Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Our Gospel this weekend comes from Matthew, where John the Baptist—now imprisoned—sends word to Jesus asking, “*Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?*” When we find ourselves stuck in the prisons of our own making—caught in discouragement, doubt, or fear—what do we do to free ourselves? How do we move toward healing, wholeness, and a renewed capacity to live with purpose? What restores within us the freedom to act with love, forgiveness, mercy, and transformation, as Jesus does? When Jesus receives John’s question, he doesn’t answer with ideas or theories. He points to what is unfolding before their eyes—signs of God’s grace making people whole again:

- the blind regain their sight
- the lame walk
- lepers are cleansed
- the deaf hear
- the dead are raised
- the poor have the Good News proclaimed to them

And he adds, “*Blessed is the one who takes no offense at me.*”

This Advent, are we allowing ourselves to be made whole again? Are we letting grace break the chains of harmful self-doubt, shifting our “questions” into a holy longing for God? Are we preparing our minds, hearts, and souls to receive His blessings fully—and with gratitude? As we move toward final exams, graduations, and the last days of Advent, may the echo of *Emmanuel* ring joyfully within us. May it clear away the clutter of our “monkey minds” and usher in the peace and blessing of this Season of Grace. On this Third Sunday of Advent—Gaudete Sunday—we rejoice in God’s promise to light our way through every shadow. This last week we honored Our Lady of Guadalupe, whose tender words to Juan Diego helped him walk forward through fear and doubt, reclaiming his dignity and speaking truth with charity. Let us pause and receive her consoling message: “Hear me and understand well, my little son, that nothing should frighten or grieve you... Am I not here, who am your Mother? Are you not under my protection? Am I not your health? Are you not happily within my fold?... Climb, my dear son, to the top of the hill... there you will find the flowers. Gather them, assemble them, and bring them into my presence...” We, too, have been baptized in the same waters and sealed with the same Holy Spirit. We, too, are wrapped—like Juan Diego—in the loving mantle of our Blessed Mother.

May we go forth unburdened, freed from anything that clouds our clarity or draws us into darkness, drama, or unnecessary fear. May we join John the Baptist in preparing the way of the Lord here in our own Tucson desert. May we—together—Be One.

Amen! Alleluia!
