



Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

As we arrive at the Fourth Sunday of Advent and move into the joy of Christmas, the Church once again places before us the holy courage of Mary and the quiet, trusting faith of Joseph. Faced with uncertainty and fear, both chose deep listening. Both allowed God to enter their lives in unexpected ways. Their witness reminds us that God is always present—especially when the path ahead feels unclear.

Christmas celebrates God “bearing down” upon our humanity. In the birth of Christ, God proclaims that light is stronger than darkness, love is greater than fear, and hope is never lost. Even amid human weakness and brokenness, God continues to bring forth faith, hope, and love—creating transformation and new life. As we move toward a New Year, may the light of Christ guide us through the dramas, jealousies, and failures—our own and those of others. May we resist fear-driven, “Herodian-like” responses, and instead embrace the deep-listening obedience of Mary and Joseph. May their faith be the bright star that leads us into 2025 with courage, joy, and peace.

In 2026, the St. Thomas More Catholic Newman Center will celebrate 100 years of ministry—a century of forming students, building community, and proclaiming the Gospel on campus. As we prepare for this Centennial, we do so rooted in prayer and united by a simple hope: that we truly May Be One.
