## Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

**W**ith the celebration of Pentecost behind us, we now find ourselves immersed in the radiant afterglow of the Easter season—a light that leads us into two profound feasts: Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi. Today, we turn our hearts to the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity—the divine communion of love that is the very source of all Creation, Reconciliation, and Sanctification. This is the God who “so loved the world” that He not only called it into being, but entered into it—not out of need or obligation, but out of infinite love. A love that refuses to leave us in our fallenness or division, but rather meets us in our humanity to lift us up—to reconcile, to heal, and to make whole.

In our baptism, the isolating effects of sin are washed away, and we are drawn into God’s family—adopted into divine life—and entrusted with the call to reflect the life-giving love of Christ in our world. The Trinity is not merely a doctrine to be understood, but a living relationship to be encountered. God’s very nature is relational: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—distinct, yet perfectly united. This mystery shows us that to be made in God’s image is to be made for communion... for connection... for love in action. And this love is not passive. It creates. It reconciles. It sanctifies. It meets a broken world not with indifference, but with compassion—not with fear, but with hope.

As we sign ourselves with the Cross—on our forehead and our heart—may we remember that we bear the name of a God who continues to create, to heal, and to empower us, even now. Especially now. In these days of social unrest, protest, and deepening anxiety in Los Angeles and beyond—we must remember that God is not distant from our pain. The Trinity reminds us that we are never alone in our struggles. God walks with us in our longing for justice, in our cries for peace, and in our exhaustion from division.

Let us not lose heart. Let us breathe deeply of God’s inner life—the peace that passes understanding. Let us seek to be people of reconciliation, mercy, and courageous love. “Love your enemies,” Jesus says. “Do good... expecting nothing in return.” And as we approach Father’s Day this weekend, we lift up all fathers, grandfathers, godfathers, spiritual fathers, and father-figures in our lives. May they be strengthened by the example of God the Father—who gives, who guides, and who never withholds His love. In the midst of uncertainty, may their presence be a source of stability, wisdom, and tender strength.

May that same love-grounded in the heart of the Trinity—take root in all of us. And may it shape how we listen, how we speak, how we pray, and how we act in these times. God is with us. And God’s love will have the final word.

Amen! Alleluia!
