Our heartfelt prayers will be with him as he prepares to assume his new role on March 18th.

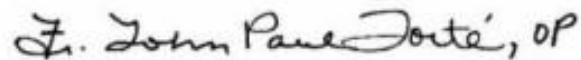
Naturally, many of you may be wondering—as I did—what this means for our Newman Center expansion project in light of these developments.

In light of my impending transfer to Detroit, the diocesan campaign to raise funds for the Newman Center and other parishes is currently on pause. As you are aware, with new diocesan leadership in the coming months there could be new and different priorities. With this in mind, Ruotolo Associates will no longer be on retainer with the Diocese as of April 1, 2025.

While I can say for certain that there will be no Diocesan-wide campaign in the coming year, there 'very likely will be a quiet major gift campaign, but just for the Newman Center project.'

This will be managed by the Catholic Foundation.
