Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

By patient endurance you will save your life.” These words from this Sunday’s Gospel remind me of the importance of keeping our eyes fixed on the prize—on Christ himself. As we near the close of a very full and often hectic semester, many of us may find ourselves stretched thin, navigating different thoughts, emotions, and uncertainties about the future. It’s in these very moments that the call to patient endurance becomes not just a moral suggestion, but a spiritual necessity.

God’s desire is for us to make it—to persevere through the inevitable challenges, doubts, and detours of life—and to build a community rooted in faith, hope, and love upon the steady foundation of endurance. The Gospel was first spoken to people who, like us, faced adversity and fear about what was unfolding around them. Jesus’ words are not meant to frighten, but to free us—to invite us to breathe deeply, to trust God’s timing, and to find the compassion and strength that flow from His presence.

It is this very faith that enables us to keep walking forward—to continue praying, seeking truth, doing justice, and embracing charity even when the path feels long or uncertain. As we gather around the Eucharistic table this weekend, may we truly hear and receive both the Word proclaimed and the Sacrament offered. May Christ enter more deeply into our hearts, minds, and lives, empowering us to “go in peace to love and serve the Lord.”

May our attitudes and actions—no matter where we stand or how we feel about what lies ahead—be grounded in the enduring love of Christ, who never gives up on us. And may we, through patient endurance, move forward together in hope, doing good and becoming ever more one in Him.

Amen! Alleluia!


