Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together."

Today we celebrate the final Sunday of our liturgical year — the Solemnity of Christ the King. Christ is the loving Sovereign of all creation — of the earth, the cosmos, and the heavens themselves. His kingship flows from the very essence of God's own being, from which all creation was called into existence and freed from the poison of the one who seeks only to deceive and divide.

Christ the King heals creation and humanity at their roots and calls forth true transformation — especially in those who are willing to follow him and allow God's love, truth, and peace to enter every moment and circumstance of life. This requires great trust, faith, and patience. Yet when these virtues are practiced and struggled with over time, they yield a deep peace, freedom, and truth — an interior strength that steadies us in all seasons of life.

In today's Gospel, we encounter Jesus in the full intensity of his crucifixion — surrounded by hatred, enduring unimaginable pain — and yet still ministering from the Cross. He recognizes the faith of the repentant thief, who pleads, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." And with what breath remains to Him, Jesus replies without hesitation: "Truly I tell you, this day you will be with me in paradise." From the Cross, Christ sees and holds the needs of our struggling humanity —

- those seeking shelter from storms and natural disasters,
- immigrants yearning for security and belonging,
- families and students grieving loved ones gone too soon,
- those burdened by illness of mind, body, or spirit,
- and all who suffer under division, conflict, and confusion — even within the Body of Christ itself.

Christ, the King of Love, sees us and hears our plea to be admitted into His Kingdom. Through Baptism, His Spirit dwells within us, and it is deepened whenever we share in the Sacraments, practice the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, and live in ways that reflect God's love and care for creation.

May we celebrate our participation in Christ's Kingdom by proclaiming his saving goodness—in word and in deed. As we prepare to enter Advent, Christmas, and a new liturgical year, may God's resting Spirit continue to anoint us and renew us. May the Good News according to St. Luke guide us to the treasure of grace within our hearts—helping us to look up from whatever weighs us down, to see how the Lord clothes the lilies of the field and feeds the birds of the air. He has them—and God has us. May Christ, our King and Good Shepherd, help us — by the power of the Holy Spirit—to remove anything that blocks us from hearing his call to a freer life, grounded in the truth and love of God! May We Be One!

Amen! Alleluia!

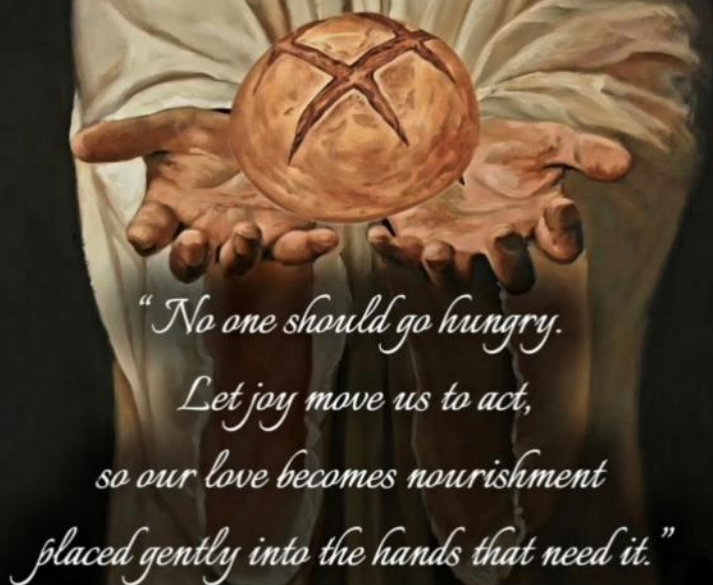
