



# Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

The quiet light of Advent breaks gently into our chaos and invites us home. It calls us to join the ancient mantra, "O come, O come, Emmanuel," whose echo rises above all the noise—illuminating our path through these December days and opening the doorway to Christmas glory. Advent is, at its heart, an invitation: An invitation to slow both our outer pace and our inner rushing... to attune ourselves to the quiet rhythms of our hearts, minds, relationships, and spirits. As the nights grow longer and darker, December reminds us that the true Light of the world is already here—offering guidance in our questions, struggles, losses, preparations for finals, and our longing for peace. That same Light also beckons us to ask a serious question: Are we ready to climb God's mountain?

As the first reading challenges us, will we climb out of quarreling and bitterness... out of hatred and cancel culture... out of fear and indifference? Will we allow the Lord to transform our swords and spears—our warring and harmful conflicts—into pruning hooks and ploughshares... tools for cultivating reconciliation, deep community, and good stewardship of one another and our world?

In today's second reading, we are urged to "throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light." Our task is to remain faithful and vigilant—discerning what plunges us into fog and shadow, and what helps us step more fully into the light of Christ's love and peace. This is what we practice every time we come to Mass, go to confession, or reach out to someone in need—whether we help perfectly or imperfectly. God does not ask us to stop praying when life grows chaotic. Instead, He invites us to take a deep... deep... deep breath, and to pray more honestly, more truly, from the place where we actually are. God always hears our prayers. The deeper question is: Do we hear God speaking back to us? Especially when life feels crazy, confusing, or heavy? God is always speaking, always reaching, always calling us into the grace and freedom of His love. The real invitation is whether we will allow His Spirit to touch our hearts exactly where they most need healing.

May the spirit of this season echo the beautiful truth of "God with us." May these days of crisp sunrises and cool evenings bless us with peace. May we know the healing Light of the Word made Flesh. And may we begin this Advent season with hearts, minds, and souls open—willing to listen, to search, and to welcome God's loving embrace in every moment of life. For it is there, in those very moments, that true transformation takes place. May we be one!

Amen! Alleluia!


