



Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Blessings and good wishes as we enter a new semester at the University of Arizona. Isn't it hard to believe that we are already more than halfway through the month of January? Most the visible signs of Christmas have disappeared—with the rare exception of those who keep their holiday lights up all year, simply turning them off when the season passes. But just because the *material* signs of Christmas fade, does that mean its *light* and peace is no longer present?

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist points passionately to Jesus, and proclaims Him as the Lamb of God, the One who baptizes with fire and the Holy Spirit. In this way, Christ keeps the light and peace of our own baptism alive—a light that remains present, even when other lights around us grow dim or simply go out. We need that light now, more than ever. We need it to guide us through a new semester, a new year, and through times of social, political, and religious unrest. In times that can displace people, unsettle communities, and crush the human spirit. In all of this, Jesus is our support. He is the Lamb of God who lifts our sins and our burdens. He helps us shed worry, heal wounds, and to confront the demons of despair, lack of confidence, addiction, and pride.

Christ is the person—and the place—to whom we must constantly practice returning. He is the One in whom we remain grounded and it is here that the Father speaks clearly and consistently. It is here... that his Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity rest—and is deeply and truly present. Here, we 'must practice' again and again: sitting, absorbing, adoring, being reconciled—in Him and with one another.

May our studies this semester not only stimulate our minds, but also move our hearts and our actions—outward in love, especially toward those most in need of our care and compassion. May the grace, mercy, and peace, of God be with us—as we prepare ourselves for our Centennial Year—one hundred years of Newman Center ministry. May the Holy Spirit shape us into people of faith, hope and charity. May We Be One!

This weekend, as we honor and remember the life and dream of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr, let us reflect on his words and bending our ears toward 'your voice' speaking through him, and inviting us to "Come and see" what Christ has to offer us today. Dr. King says:

- ***If you can't be a tree, be a bush***
- ***If you can't be a highway, be a trail***
- ***If you can't be the sun, be a star***
- ***For it isn't by size that you win or fail, (so) be the best of whatever you are.***—Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., 1967

And these final words, spoken just days before his death: "*We've got some difficult days ahead... But it really doesn't matter to me now, because I've been to the mountaintop. I've looked over, and I've seen the Promised Land. I may not get there with you, but I want you to know tonight that we, as a people, will get to the Promised Land.*"—April 3, 1968

May we walk forward in that same hope—guided by Christ, strengthened by His presence, and illuminated by a light that never fades. May we be One in Christ, Who makes all things new!

Amen! Alleluia!




