Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

To be held in God's care is a deeply securing experience. It is not a grip that crushes or possesses, but a steady, life-giving embrace—like the hand of a mother or father, a caring friend, mentor, teacher, or campus minister. It is a presence that soothes, nurtures, and gently empowers us forward... even lifting us high upon strong and loving shoulders. This is the presence of the Good Shepherd—whose voice is familiar, clarifying, and protective. The One who walks with us through both lush green pastures and the darkest valleys, never abandoning us along the way. Jesus is this Good Shepherd, and His call is always an invitation: to remain within the powerful echo of Easter—an echo of healing, renewal, and peace that resounds throughout these fifty sacred days. When we doubt, question, or struggle, He speaks: "Peace be with you." When we fail, miss the mark, or drift away, He calls us back: "Be open... receive the Holy Spirit." Christ Jesus says to each of us: Do not remain in what is lifeless—rise. Do not stay stuck, confused, or stranded—rise. Do not remain in unforgiveness—rise!

In a world filled with competing voices, it is easy to feel pulled in every direction. Which path do I choose? Which voice speaks truth? What course, relationship, or vocation am I called to follow? In moments like these, our prayer becomes simple and honest: "Christ Jesus, be my light and my Shepherd. Be the voice that calls me—gently, and when needed, firmly—through the narrow gate. Lead me away from what distracts and diminishes, and guide me toward restful waters, toward clarity, purpose, and peace." As we celebrate this Easter season—and as we joyfully mark the Centennial of our Newman Center, embracing our theme "May We Be One"—we are reminded that Christ continues to gather us, guide us, and unite us. For one hundred years, His voice has echoed through this community, forming students in faith, truth, and love. That same voice still calls today. May the peace of the Resurrection flow abundantly over all our students—especially those preparing to graduate, and all who are bringing this semester to completion. May you be given the focus, clarity, and strength to finish well. And may Christ's healing love reach into the conflicts of our world, inspiring us—like the early Church—to live and pray in His Spirit. May we be one in Him, and in His Spirit.

Amen. Alleluia, Alleluia.

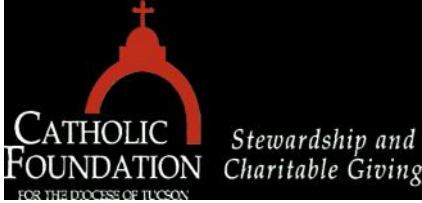
