Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

To love God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—is not simply to believe in an idea, but to enter into a living relationship of love. For God is one, yet revealed in three Persons—a communion of love that invites us in.

In today's first reading, we witness Philip, filled with the Holy Spirit, moving with courage and conviction. His life becomes a channel of God's grace—where healing happens, hope is restored, and lives are renewed. What we see in Philip is not just a moment in history, but a pattern for our own lives. We, too, have been called into existence by God, formed and redeemed in Christ, and sent forth in the power of the Holy Spirit to bring about "resurrection" in the world around us. Every act of compassion, every word of truth, every moment of courage becomes a spark of Easter life breaking into the ordinary. And this weekend, that truth felt especially alive among us. Many of us gathered just last night for our centennial event, "Where It All Began—A Journey into Deeper Life, Faith, the Cosmos, and Community... a Newman 100-year sojourn." It wasn't just a look back—it was a reminder that God has been faithfully at work through every generation of this community. Through stories shared, laughter exchanged, and hearts stirred, we could sense something deeper: that we are part of something much bigger than ourselves. A living story. A Spirit-led journey. For 100 years, this Newman Center has been a place where faith has taken root, where vocations have been discerned, where friendships have been forged, and where countless lives have been quietly transformed by the Holy Spirit. And now—this same Spirit, this same story—is being entrusted to us.

This weekend also invites us into deep gratitude. We give thanks for our mothers, grandmothers, guardians, and all who have embodied the gift of "motherhood" in our lives. Their love reflects something profoundly divine—steady, sacrificial, and life-giving. Whether in family life or as mentors and guides, they show us what it means to let God's love shine through everyday moments. The world needs that witness—now more than ever. And to our graduates—this is your moment. You stand at a threshold, not just of accomplishment, but of mission. Your degree is not simply an ending—it is a sending. The world you are entering needs more than your knowledge—it needs your light. As you step into careers, vocations, and future callings—whether as leaders, servants, spouses, parents, or mentors—remember this: you carry the Holy Spirit within you. The same Spirit that animated Philip, the same Spirit that has guided this Newman community for a century, now dwells in you.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us: "**If you love Me, you will keep My Commandment and I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, who remains with you, and will be in you.**" This is our call: to remain in Him, and to let Him remain in us. To stay rooted in that relationship of love and to let that love shine. So as we carry forward the grace of last night, the legacy of 100 years, and the hope of new beginnings—go forth with confidence. Let the Spirit move through you. Let your lives reflect the light you have received. Be the ones who continue the story. Be the ones who bring resurrection into the world.

Alleluia! Come, Holy Spirit. Amen!
