Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

The power of the Easter Season calls us to far more than remembrance. It invites us to carry the hope of the Resurrection beyond the pages of Scripture and into our hearts, our relationships, and the very fabric of our daily lives. Today, we hear Jesus commissioning his followers to go into the whole world and proclaim the love and promise of the Triune God to all people. But how do we live this mission in a world saturated with noise, skepticism, division, and exhaustion? We do it gradually, faithfully, courageously and abundantly. Yes, there are countless reasons to hesitate. Yet, if we truly long for renewal, a transformation that reaches deeper than surface-level change, we must accept the invitation to rise above the weariness of war, political strife, social inequality, religious division, and the many forms of suffering that weigh upon the human spirit. Jesus's final command to his disciples was clear and urgent:

- Go.
- Go and baptize.
- Go and heal.

Preach. Lift up. Build bridges. Forgive. Reconcile. See. Love. Bring peace. Come, Holy Spirit, and renew the face of the earth.

This past weekend, we celebrated many of our students graduating and being sent forth into the wider world and into new chapters of life. In a beautiful way, their graduation mirrors the mystery of the Ascension. The disciples could no longer remain standing still, gazing upward. They had to go forward, carrying Christ into the world. And so it is with our graduates. They leave classrooms, campus life, friendships, and familiar routines not simply to pursue careers or success, but to become living witnesses of hope, truth, compassion, and faith wherever life leads them. Their mission field now stretches far beyond the university walls. As we continue celebrating this Centennial Year of our Newman Center community, we remember that for one hundred years generations of students have come here searching for meaning, friendship, truth, and God. They have prayed here, struggled here, discovered their vocation here, and ultimately been sent forth from this sacred place into the life of the world. The Holy Spirit continues to stir hearts just as powerfully today. At the Ascension, the Angels ask the disciples: "Why do you stand here looking up toward heaven?" In other words: Go, share what you have seen and heard. Live what you have received, and remember, I am with you always. This is the Great Commission and the divine promise of accompaniment. And may our graduates, and all of us, go forward with courage, carrying the light of Christ into a world that deeply longs for hope.

Alleluia! Come, Holy Spirit. Amen!
