Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth.” Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday and bring the Easter Season to its glorious fulfillment. Over these past fifty days, we have walked with the Risen Christ through hope, renewal, reconciliation, and new life. In the weeks ahead, the Church will continue to draw us deeper into the mystery of God’s life and love through the great feasts of the Holy Trinity and Corpus Christi, celebrating both the inner life of God and the sustaining gift of Christ’s Body and Blood alive within His Church and Sacraments.

Here at the Newman Center, we also begin moving into a quieter summer rhythm. The campus slows down, students head home, internships begin, graduates step into new chapters, and yet the Spirit of God continues to move powerfully in and through this community. This Centennial Year has been a beautiful reminder that for one hundred years Newman has been far more than a campus ministry building. It has been a spiritual home, a place where generations of students, alumni, resident parishioners, faculty, families, and friends have encountered Christ, discovered deeper purpose, formed lifelong friendships, and been sent forth into the world renewed by faith, and what a grace-filled year it has been. We are also profoundly grateful for the faithful stewardship of our resident community, alumni, benefactors, and friends of Newman, those who continue to step forward with generosity, service, and love to strengthen this sacred mission for future generations of students. In a particular way, I want to acknowledge Joe and Suzanne McChain, whose leadership as Centennial co-chairs has been extraordinary. Together with many devoted members of our resident community, they have helped guide this celebration with joy, vision, faith, and tremendous dedication. Their generosity reflects the very spirit of Pentecost: people offering their gifts so that the mission of Christ may continue to flourish. The same Holy Spirit that rushed upon the early followers of Jesus continues to breathe life into our community today. The Spirit comforts us, strengthens us, challenges us, and continually calls us beyond complacency into deeper discipleship and sanctifying grace, and we can feel it here. We see it in students seeking truth and belonging. We see it in graduates being sent forth into the wider world. We see it in alumni reconnecting with the place that helped shape their faith. We see it in the faithful service of our parishioners, staff, volunteers, and benefactors. We see it in the renewed energy, hope, and spiritual hunger alive within our Newman family.

May we continue to rise with Christ beyond the Easter Season and remain open to the surprising movement of the Holy Spirit in both familiar and unknown places. May the Holy Spirit continue to stir our Newman community with courage, joy, wisdom, healing, and missionary love. May God continue to renew the face of the earth, beginning with each one of us.

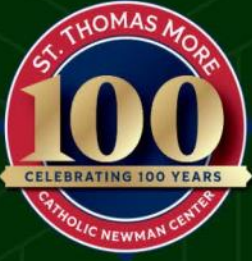

Greetings, Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

My name is **Maria Marin**, and I am the proud Gold Star Mother of **Fallen United States Airborne Army Ranger Sgt. Martin A. Lugo, C. Co. 1st PLT, 1/75 RGR BN, KIA 8-19-10 Operation Enduring Freedom.**

Although nearly sixteen years have passed since my son was met by St. Michael and his army of Angels on the battlefield and ushered into Heaven, there are days when it feels as though it happened only sixteen minutes ago. I used to tell him that there was no time nor distance that could ever separate us — and by the grace and mercy of God, I still believe this is true because I have survived the heartache of losing my son. Although he is physically not present, his spirit and love live fully and permanently in my heart and soul. For me, this has been a challenging journey of which I couldn't have traveled without God's blessings of family, friends, our Catholic community, friends from other Christian denominations as well as my Jewish friends.

As we prepare to observe Memorial Day and honor those who sacrificed their lives in service to our Nation, let us remember that many of them served God above all else. I know this to be true of my Martin, and of my Dad, who now rest side by side at Holy Hope Cemetery.

In our home, every day is Memorial Day. But having a designated day like this coming Monday brings a special kind of comfort to me and my family. Attending the Memorial Day Mass at Holy Hope allows us, as a community, to come together — to grieve, to reflect, to celebrate, and to express our gratitude for the soldiers who answered the call:

“Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, ‘Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?’ And I said, ‘Here I am, Lord, send me!’” — Isaiah 6:8

I hope to see you at Holy Hope Cemetery for this blessed Memorial Day Mass on **Monday, May 25, 2026 at 8:00 a.m.** May we stand together in faith, remembrance, and love as we honor our fallen heroes.
