Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

With the celebration of Pentecost behind us, we now find ourselves immersed in the radiant afterglow of the Easter season, a light that leads us into two profound feasts: Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi. Today, we turn our hearts to the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity — the divine communion of love that is the very source of Creation, Reconciliation, and Sanctification. This is the God who “so loved the world” that He not only called it into being, but entered into it, not out of need or obligation, but out of infinite love. A love that refuses to leave humanity trapped in division, violence, or despair, but continually reaches toward us to heal, restore, and make us one. Through baptism, the isolating effects of sin are washed away, and we are drawn into God’s family, adopted into divine life, entrusted with the mission of reflecting Christ’s love in the world. The Trinity is not merely a doctrine to be explained, but a living relationship to be encountered. God’s very nature is relational: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, distinct, yet perfectly united in love. This mystery reveals something essential about our own humanity: that we are made for communion, for relationship, for unity grounded in truth, mercy, and self-giving love. And this divine love is never passive. It creates. It reconciles. It sanctifies. It enters into a wounded world not with indifference, but with compassion, not with vengeance, but with peace. Especially in these times, as wars rage across nations, as innocent lives are lost through violence and displacement, and as fear, division, and uncertainty continue to shape so much of our global community, we are reminded of the urgent need to rediscover our shared dignity as children of God. In recent months, Pope Leo has continued to call the world to reject the temptation of hatred, dehumanization, and reckless exploitation — urging leaders and peoples alike to become true stewards of human life, creation, and the fragile bonds that unite us. His call is ultimately a Gospel call: to protect the vulnerable, to seek peace over power, and to remember that authentic greatness is found not in domination, but in love and service. The Trinity teaches us that unity does not erase difference, it harmonizes it in love. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit exist in perfect communion, and from that communion flows all life. So too, our world will never be healed through isolation, revenge, or indifference, but only through reconciliation, humility, and courageous mercy. As we sign ourselves with the Cross, on our forehead and over our heart, may we remember that we bear the name of a God who continues to create, heal, and strengthen His people even now. Let us not lose heart. Let us breathe deeply of God’s inner life, the peace that surpasses understanding. Let us become people of reconciliation, mercy, and courageous hope in a world longing for healing. “Love your enemies,” Jesus says. “Do good and expect nothing in return.” And as we approach Father’s Day in the weeks ahead, we lift up all fathers, grandfathers, godfathers, spiritual fathers, and father-figures in our lives. May they be strengthened by the example of God the Father, who guides with wisdom, protects with tenderness, and never withholds His faithful love. May that same love, rooted in the heart of the Trinity, take deeper root in all of us. May it shape how we listen, how we speak, how we pray, and how we live. God is with us. And God’s love will have the final word.

Alleluia! Amen!

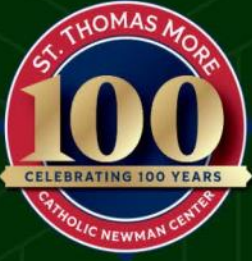
